HOW TO FIND US

St James' Church Hall is easy to reach by public transport. The nearest rail and tram stop is Elmer's End Station and the Hall is a 10 minute walk away. Come out of the station onto Elmer's End Road and turn right. Walk to the lights and turn left onto Croydon Road. The 4th turning is St James Avenue, leading directly to the church.

Many buses stop on Elmer's End Green: the 54, 194,358 & 367 from Beckenham; the 194, 356 & 338 from Shirley or Bromley and others. Details from Transport for London at www.tfl.gov.uk.

There is plenty of on street parking for cars.

Our signs will bring you to the side entrance.

SOME HELPFUL NOTES

- ❖ No previous experience of dance is required.
- ❖ A high level of fitness is not needed, but you do need to feel able to dance happily for a good part of the day.
- ❖ Wear comfortable clothes that won't restrict your movement.
- ❖ Dance shoes are ideal, but soft shoes without a high heel are fine. Most trainers are too cumbersome.
- ❖ You might like to bring a bottle of water.

OUR TEACHER -- ISABEL SURI

This weekend, organised by Pastime Historical Dance, will provide an exciting chance to meet a visiting specialist in historical dance. We will be taught by Isabel Suri a dance teacher from Switzerland. She is well known to Pastime and frequently teaches in England and across Europe.
